
E2 Handshape Order




M18 Sign Descriptions

Each of the signs described below begins on the forehead. Read the sign descriptions and make the signs. Then, write the English glosses on the lines at the end of each description. If you need help, turn the page to find the sign illustrations.

1.	I • palm in • move hand up and out
2.	1 • palm left • swing hand out and around
3.	O • palm left • circle hand out from forehead twice
4.	Open B > Y • palm in • move hand forward and down while changing to Y handshape
5.	R • palm left • arc hand forward
6.	Open B • palm in, fingers up • flip hand out and down
7.	L > Bent L • palm in • wipe index finger across forehead to the right, then bend finger
8.	1 • palm out • tap back of hand against center of forehead twice
9.	Open B > A • palm in • slide fingers across and off forehead, closing to A handshape
10.	Flattened O > 5 • palm left • move hand down to chest while opening to 5 handshape
11.	1 > X • palm down • bend and straighten index finger several times while moving hand out
12.	H • palm left • arc hand forward
